Q8. God will spread his upon the prince so that he would be taken captive.
Ezekiel 12:14 "And I will scatter toward every wind all that <i>are</i> about him to help him, and all his bands; and I will draw out the sword after them.  15 And they shall know that I <i>am</i> the LORD, when I shall scatter them among the nations, and disperse them in the countries."
Q9. Those around the prince to protect him will be among the nations.
Ezekiel 12:16 "But I will leave a few men of them from the sword, from the famine, and from the pestilence; that they may declare all their abominations among the heathen whither they come; and they shall know that I am the LORD."
