

Exodus 16

I. The wilderness of Sin. Vs. 1-3

- A. The children of Israel left Elim and camped by the Red Sea. Numbers 33:10
- B. The children of Israel left the Red Sea and camped in the wilderness of Sin. Vs. 1, Numbers 33:11
- C. The children of Israel reached the wilderness of Sin on the 15th day of the second month after they left Egypt. Vs. 1
- D. The wilderness of Sin is located between Elim and Sinai. Vs. 1
- E. The whole congregation murmured against Moses and Aaron because of no food. Vs. 2-3

II. The promise of bread. Vs. 4-8

- A. God would rain bread from heaven. Vs. 4, Psalms 78:24
- B. Manna was Angels' food. Psalms 78:25
- C. The people would gather a certain rate every day. Vs. 4
 - 1. This was to see if they would obey God or not. Vs. 4, Deuteronomy 8:2-4
- D. On the sixth day they would gather twice as much. Vs. 5
- E. By evening they would know that God brought them out. Vs. 6
- F. In the morning they would see the glory of the Lord. Vs. 7
- G. God would give flesh to eat in the evening. Vs. 8
- H. God would give bread to the full in the morning. Vs. 8

III. The confirmation of Moses. Vs. 9-12

- A. They saw the glory of God in a cloud talking to Moses.

IV. The sending of manna. Vs. 13-31

- A. That evening quails came up and covered the camp. Vs. 13
- B. In the morning dew was all around the camp. Vs. 13
 - 1. The manna fell upon the dew. Numbers 11:9
 - 2. When the dew was gone, a small round thing was on the ground. Vs. 14

3. The round thing was as small as the hoar frost on the ground. Vs. 14

C. They called it manna: What is it? Vs. 15

D. Moses told them it was bread for them to eat. Vs. 15

E. They were to gather an omer (2 quarts) of manna for each person. Vs. 16

F. Some gathered more and had nothing left over and some less and had no lack. Vs. 17-18

G. Nothing was to be left for the morning. Vs. 19

H. The manna that was left for the morning bred worms and stank. Vs. 20

I. They gathered it every morning. Vs. 21

J. The manna melted when the day got hot. Vs. 21

K. On the sixth day they gathered twice as much. Vs. 22

L. They would not gather any on the Sabbath, the seventh day. Vs. 23-26

M. The manna that was left for the Sabbath did not stink, and there were no worms in it. Vs. 24

N. God was upset with those who went to gather manna on the Sabbath. Vs. 27-30

O. Manna was like coriander seed and white. Vs. 31

P. Manna was the color of bdellium. Numbers 11:7

1. Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary defines bdellium as "a gum or resin, a precious stone, or a pearl".

Q. Manna tasted like wafers made with honey. Vs. 31

R. Manna tasted like fresh oil. Numbers 11:8

S. They made manna into bread and cakes. Numbers 11:8

V. The keeping of manna as a testimony. Vs. 32-34

A. Moses and Aaron were to keep an omer of manna to remind them of God's care. Vs. 32-33

VI. Manna eaten by children of Israel for forty years. Vs. 35-36

A. Manna is symbolic of Jesus. John 6:31-35
