A. Moses was 80 years old. Vs. 7

B. Aaron was 83 years old. Vs. 7

III. Aaron's rod turns into a serpent. Vs. 8-13

A. Moses told Aaron to cast his rod before Pharaoh. Vs. 8-9


B. Aaron's rod became a serpent. Vs. 10

C. Pharaoh's magicians cast their rod on the ground and they became serpents. Vs. 11-12

D. Aaron's rod swallowed up their rods. Vs. 12

IV. The first plague of water turned into blood. Vs. 14-25

Exodus 7:15-25
Plague- Water turned to blood against the Egyptian god, Hapi. Exodus 12:12



Hapi -
Egyptian god of the Nile.

This Egyptian god was a water bearer.

D. Moses and Aaron met Pharaoh at the river. Vs. 20

E. Aaron smote the river with his rod. Vs. 20

F. All the water in Egypt turned to blood. Vs. 20-21

B. Moses has Aaron to stretch his hand over the waters for the frogs to come up. Vs. 5-6

C. Pharaoh's magicians did the same. Vs. 7

D. Pharaoh will let the people go if the frogs are taken away. Vs. 8

E. Moses asks Pharaoh when he wanted to frogs to be taken away. Vs. 9-11

1. Pharaoh said tomorrow. Vs. 10

F. Moses prayed that the frogs would be taken away tomorrow. Vs. 12-14

1. God removed the frogs the next day. Vs. 13

G. Pharaoh hardened his heart and did not let the people go. Vs. 15

II. The plague of lice. Vs. 16-19

Plague- Lice from the dust of the earth against the Egyptian god, Geb.
