I. The fifth plague: Livestock of Egypt. Vs. 1-7

Exodus 9:1-7 Plague #5 - Death of the livestock against the Egyptian god, Hathor. Hathor Egyptian goddess of Love and Protection.

> Usually this Egyptian goddess was depicted with the head of a cow.


- A. Moses told Pharaoh to let the people go or God would smite the Egyptian livestock. Vs. 1-3
- B. The livestock of Israel would be spared. Vs. 4

C. On the next day the livestock of the Egyptians died. Vs. 5-6

D. None of the livestock of Israel died. Vs. 6

E. Pharaoh's heart was hardened. Vs. 7

II. The sixth plague: Boils. Vs. 8-12



- A. God told Moses to throw handfuls of ashes of the furnace in the air before Pharaoh. Vs. 8
- B. The ashes would turn to boils upon the Egyptians and their animals. Vs. 9-10
- C. Pharaoh's magicians were affected by the boils. Vs. 11

D. The Lord hardened the heart of Pharaoh. Vs. 12

- B. If Pharaoh did not let the people go, God would rain hail and fire upon Egypt except where the children of God were. Vs. 13-21
- C. God rained hail and fire upon Egypt except where the children of God were. Vs. 22-26
- **D.** Pharaoh called for Moses and Aaron. Vs. 27
- E. Pharaoh would let the people go if the hail and fire stopped. Vs. 27-32
- F. Moses prayed to God, and the hail and fire ceased. Vs. 33
- G. Pharaoh hardened his heart and did not let the people go. Vs. 34-35


Exodus 10

I. The eighth plague: Locus. Vs. 1-20

Exodus 10:1-20 Plague #8 - Locusts sent from the sky against the Egyptian god, Seth. Exodus 12:12

> Seth Egyptian god of Storms and Disorder.

- A. Moses told Pharaoh to let the people go or tomorrow God would send locusts Upon Egypt. Vs. 1-6
- B. Pharaoh's servants pleaded with Pharaoh to let the people go. Vs. 7
- C. Moses told Pharaoh that all the people, young and old, were to go. Vs. 8-9
- D. Pharaoh told Moses that only the men could go. Vs. 10-11
- E. God had the east wind to blow a day and night which brought the locusts into Egypt. Vs. 12-13
- F. The locusts destroyed all the trees and crops in Egypt. Vs. 14-15
- G. Pharaoh repented and asked Moses to pray that the locusts would be removed. Vs. 16-17
- H. Moses prayed and God sent the west wind and cast the locusts into the Red Sea. Vs. 18-19



I. God hardened Pharaoh's heart and he would not let the people go. Vs. 20

II. The ninth plague: Darkness. Vs. 21-29



- A. God told Moses to stretch his hand toward heaven and there would be darkness over Egypt. Vs. 21
- **B.** Darkness was so thick that the Egyptians could not see one another for three days. Vs. 22-23
- C. The children of Israel had light. Vs. 23
- D. Pharaoh told Moses to go but leave the flocks and herds behind. Vs. 24
- E. Moses told Pharaoh that everything must go. Vs. 25-26
- F. God hardened Pharaoh's heart, and he would not let them go. Vs. 27
- G. Pharaoh told Moses not to see his face anymore or he would die. Vs. 28
- H. Moses told Pharaoh that he would not see his face again. Vs. 29
