Prophecies of Isaiah 49 Isaiah 30:8 – Isaiah is to write the prophecies in a book.

- 1. Isaiah 49:1a -("Listen, O isles, unto me; and hearken, ye people, from
  - "Listen, O isles, unto me; and hearken, ye people, from far; The
  - **LORD** hath called me from the womb; from the bowels of my mother hath he made mention of my name." far;") The Messiah would come for all people.

<u>1 Timothy 2:4-6</u> "Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth.

5 For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus;

6 Who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time."

2. Isaiah 49:1b- ("The LORD hath called me from the womb;") The Messiah would be called by God while in the womb.

Matthew 1:20-21 "But while he thought on these things, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared unto him in a dream, saying, Joseph, thou son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary thy wife: for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Ghost. 21 And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins."

3. Isaiah 49:1c – ("from the bowels of my mother hath he made mention of my name.") The Messiah would be called by His name before he was born.

<u>Luke 1:30-31</u> "30 And the angel said unto her, Fear not, Mary: for thou hast found favour with God.

31 And, behold, thou shalt conceive in thy womb, and bring forth a son, and shalt call his name JESUS."

> <u>Revelation 2:12</u> "And to the angel of the church in Pergamos write; These things saith he which hath the sharp sword with two edges;"

5. Isaiah 49:2b- ("in the shadow of his hand hath he hid me, and made me a polished shaft; in his quiver hath he hid me;") The Messiah would be protected by God.

Matthew 2:13-15 "And when they were departed, behold, the angel of the Lord appeareth to Joseph in a dream, saying, Arise, and take the young child and his mother, and flee into Egypt, and be thou there until I bring thee word: for Herod will seek the young child to destroy him.

14 When he arose, he took the young child and his mother by night, and departed into Egypt:

15 And was there until the death of Herod: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, Out of Egypt have I called my son."

6. Isaiah 49:5a - The Messiah would be God's servant.

\*\* "And now, saith the LORD that formed me from the womb to be his servant, to bring Jacob again to him, Though Israel be not gathered, yet shall I be glorious in the eyes of the LORD, and my God shall be my strength."

<u>John 6:38</u> "For I came down from heaven, not to do mine own will, but the will of him that sent me."

7. Isaiah 49:5b - The Messiah would come to bring Israel back to God.

<u>Matthew 15:24</u> "But he answered and said, I am not sent but unto the lost sheep of the house of Israel."

<u>Matthew 10:5-7</u> "These twelve Jesus sent forth, and commanded them, saying, Go not into the way of the Gentiles, and into any city of the Samaritans enter ye not:

6 But go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.

7 And as ye go, preach, saying, The kingdom of heaven is at hand." 8. Isaiah 49:6b - The Messiah would be a light to the Gentiles.

\*\* "And he said, It is a light thing that thou shouldest be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob, and to restore the preserved of Israel: I will also give thee for a light to the Gentiles, that thou mayest be my salvation unto the end of the earth."

Acts 13:47-48 "For so hath the Lord commanded us, saying, I have set thee to be a light of the Gentiles, that thou shouldest be for salvation unto the ends of the earth.

48 And when the Gentiles heard this, they were glad, and glorified the word of the Lord: and as many as were ordained to eternal life believed."

9. Isaiah 49:7-The Messiah would be despised.

"Thus saith the LORD, the Redeemer of Israel, and his Holy One, to him whom man despiseth, to him whom the nation abhorreth, to a servant of rulers, Kings shall see and arise, princes also shall worship, because of the LORD that is faithful, and the Holy One of Israel, and he shall choose thee."


<u>John 1:10-11</u> "He was in the world, and the world was made by him, and the world knew him not.

11 He came unto his own, and his own received him not." <u>Matthew 27:22</u> "Pilate saith unto them, What shall I do then with Jesus which is called Christ? They all say unto him, Let him be crucified." 10. Isaiah 49:8 The Messiah would bring the day of salvation.

\* "Thus saith the LORD, In an acceptable time have I heard thee, and in a day of salvation have I helped thee: and I will preserve thee, and give thee for a covenant of the people, to establish the earth, to cause to inherit the desolate heritages;"

<u>2 Corinthians 6:2</u> "(For he saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the day of salvation have I succoured thee: behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.)"

11. Isaiah 49:10 The Messiah would take care of the saved in Heaven.



<u>Revelation 7:16-17</u> "They shall hunger no more, neither thirst any more; neither shall the sun light on them, nor any heat.
17 For the Lamb which is in the midst of the throne shall feed them, and shall lead them unto living fountains of waters: and God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes."

**12. Isaiah 49:11 Elijah would prepare the way of the Lord.** 

"And I will make all my mountains a way, and my highways shall be exalted."

<u>Luke 3:4-5</u> "As it is written in the book of the words of Esaias the prophet, saying, The voice of one crying in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.

5 Every valley shall be filled, and every mountain and hill shall be brought low; and the crooked shall be made straight, and the rough ways shall be made smooth;" 13. Isaiah 49:14-15 God would not forsake Israel.

"But Zion said, The LORD hath forsaken me, and my Lord



hath forgotten me.

15 Can a woman forget her sucking child, that she should not have compassion on the son of her womb? yea, they may forget, yet will I not forget thee."

<u>Romans 11:1-5</u> "I say then, Hath God cast away his people? God forbid. For I also am an Israelite, of the seed of Abraham, of the tribe of Benjamin.

2 God hath not cast away his people which he foreknew. Wot ye not what the scripture saith of Elias? how he maketh intercession to God against Israel, saying,

**3** Lord, they have killed thy prophets, and digged down thine altars; and I am left alone, and they seek my life.

4 But what saith the answer of God unto him? I have reserved to myself seven thousand men, who have not bowed the knee to the image of Baal.

5 Even so then at this present time also there is a remnant according to the election of grace."

14. Isaiah 49:16-The Palms of the Messiah would be a witness.

"Behold, I have graven thee upon the palms of my hands; thy walls are continually before me."

John 20:25-28 "The other disciples therefore said unto him, We have seen the Lord. But he said unto them, Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe.


