- 1. The location of the Garden of Gethsemane. Mark 14:32-34**
- 2. Victory! Jesus would obey God in a garden. Mark 14:35-36**
- 3. The betrayal of Jesus would be in a garden. John 18:1-2**
- 4. Defeat and Victory: Jesus would be buried and raised in a garden on Mount Moriah. John 19:40-42, John 20:11-18**
- 5. Jesus would ascend to Heaven. Acts 1:9-12**
- 6. Jesus will stand on the mount of Olives after his 2nd coming. Zechariah 14:3-5**
 - a. Jesus will judge the Nations. Matthew 25:31-33**

II. The garden is a place Jesus went to many times. John 18:2

A. At night. Luke 21:37

B. Judas knew Jesus would be there. John 18:2

C. Jesus did not hide. John 18:3-4

- 1. Daniel did not hide. Daniel 6:7-10**
- 2. Will you hide?**

III. Judas brings a group of men and officers to take Jesus. John 18:3

A. They have lanterns, torches and weapons. Matthew 26:47, Mark 14:43

B. Jesus went to them. John 18:4

- 1. Jesus knew why they were there. John 18:4**
- 2. “Whom seek ye?” John 18:4**
 - a. “Jesus of Nazareth.” John 18:5**

3. “I Am He” John 18:5

- a. Jesus removed Judas’ betrayal.
- b. Judas did not now have to kiss Jesus to reveal him. Jesus revealed himself.

4. They fell to the ground. John 18:6

5. Jesus asked them again. John 18:7

- a. “Jesus of Nazareth” John 18:7
- b. Let my disciples go. John 18:8
 - 1) That the scriptures might be fulfilled. John 18:9

C. Judas betrays Jesus with a kiss. Matthew 26:48-49, Mark 14:44-45, Luke 22:47-48

D. They laid hands on Jesus to take him. Matthew 26:50, Mark 14:46

E. Peter drew his sword to protect Jesus. Matthew 26:51, Mark 14:47, Luke 22:49-51, John 18:10

- 1. Jesus did not need Peter’s help. Matthew 26:52-54 John 18:11

F. Why did you not arrest me in the Temple? Matthew 26:55, Mark 14:48-49, Luke 22:52-53

- 1. That the scriptures might be fulfilled. Matthew 26:56, Mark 14:50, John 18:12

IV. The Gospel of John only revealed this part of the arrest.

A. Judas brings a group of men and officers to take Jesus. John 18:3

B. Jesus went to them. John 18:4-9

C. Peter drew his sword to protect Jesus. John 18:10-12

- 1. Jesus did not need Peter’s help. John 18:11
- 2. That the scriptures might be fulfilled. John 18:12
