    - 1. Jesus was in the beginning. John 1:1
      - a. Not in the beginning God created the Word.
      - b. In the beginning was the Word.
      - c. Jesus is before all things. Colossians 1:17
      - d. God is before the mountains. Psalms 90:2
      - e. His glory before the world was. John 17:5
    - 2. The Word was with God. John 1:1-2
      - a. God is the Holy Trinity. 1 John 5:7
      - b. The Holy Trinity in three different places at the same time. Matthew 3:16-17
      - c. A good example of three as one is the equilateral triangle.
  - B. A word.
    - 1. To have a word, it must be spoken or written by a person.
