

## John 1:35-36 The Lamb of God

**December 28, 2014** 

- I. The Lamb of God. John 1:35-36
  - A. Who would know what John the Baptist was saying?
    - 1. The scribes, Pharisees, Levites and priests who claim to be Abraham's seed. John 8:33
- II. The Lamb of God was to be sacrificed for the sins of the world. John 1:29
  - A. In the Old Testament there was one sacrifice by a lamb that was not completed, it was delayed until a lamb could be provided. Genesis 22:1-13
  - B. In the Old Testament the Passover Lamb was to be sacrifice every year until it was fulfilled by the Lamb of God. Exodus 12:5-7, 11-13
  - C. Both sacrifices would be fulfilled at the same time.
    - 1. The Lamb of God would be used for both sacrifices.
  - D. The first sacrifice would show the place where the sacrifice would be completed. Genesis 22:2-4
    - 1. 1,860 years later the Lamb of God was provided, Jesus. John 1:29 "Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world."

- E. The second sacrifice would give the day for the sacrifice to be completed. On the tenth day of the first month is the day of the Passover. Exodus 12:2-3, 14
- III. 1872 Years later on the day of the Passover (John 19:13-18) on Mt. Calvary it was finished. John 19:30
  - A. "Behold the Lamb of God which taketh away the sin of the world.

    John 1:29
    - 1. This is why Jesus was sacrificed outside the Temple. Hebrews 13:12-13, Hebrews 13:10
  - B. John sees the Lamb of God again slain, but alive in Heaven. Revelation 5:6
    - 1. There stood a Lamb slain, but alive and all of Heaven and Earth broke out in praise. Revelation 5:7-14
    - 2. Worthy is the Lamb. Revelation 5:12
