

## Mark 1

- I. The introduction of Jesus through the fulfillment of prophecy. Vs. 1-8
  - A. The prophecy of Malachi 3:1. Vs. 2
    - Malachi 3:1
    - “Behold, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me: and the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to his temple, even the messenger of the covenant, whom ye delight in: behold, he shall come, saith the LORD of hosts.”
  - B. The prophecy of Isaiah 40:3. Vs. 3
    - Isaiah 40:3
    - “The voice of him that crieth in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God.”
  - C. The messenger and voice of the one that crieth in the wilderness is John the Baptist. Vs. 4-8
    - 1. John the Baptist baptized in the wilderness. Vs. 4
    - 2. John the Baptist preached the baptism of repentance. Vs. 4
    - 3. Many went to John to be baptized. Vs. 5
    - 4. John the Baptist was clothed with camel’s hair and ate locust and wild honey. Vs. 6
    - 5. John the Baptist preached that there was a mightier one coming that would baptize with the Holy Ghost. Vs. 7-8
- II. The baptism of Jesus. Vs. 9-11
  - A. Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist in the Jordan River. Vs. 9
  - B. The Holy Trinity was present at the Baptism of Jesus. Vs. 10-11
    - 1. God the Father spoke from heaven. Vs. 11
    - 2. The Holy Spirit descending upon Jesus. Vs. 10
    - 3. Jesus the Son of God baptized in the water. Vs. 10
- III. The temptation of Jesus. Vs. 12-13
  - A. The Spirit drove Jesus into the wilderness. Vs. 12
  - B. Jesus was in the wilderness forty days with the wild beasts. Vs. 13
  - C. Jesus was tempted by Satan. Vs. 13

- D. The angels ministered unto Jesus. Vs. 13
- IV. John the Baptist put in prison. Vs. 14
- V. Jesus preaches in Galilee. Vs. 14-15
  - A. “The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand: repent ye, and believe the gospel.” Vs. 15
- VI. Jesus calls four fishermen by the Sea of Galilee. Vs. 16-20
  - A. Two brothers, Simon and Andrew. Vs. 16
    - 1. “Come ye after me, and I will make you to become fishers of men.” Vs. 17
    - 2. Immediately they forsook their nets, and followed him. Vs. 18
  - B. Two brothers, James and John. Vs. 19
    - 1. Immediately they left their father Zebedee, and followed him. Vs. 20
- VII. Jesus teaches in the Synagogue at Capernaum on the Sabbath. Vs. 21-22
  - A. Jesus taught as one that had authority, and not as the scribes. Vs. 22
- VIII. Jesus casts out a demon. Vs. 23-28
  - A. There was a man with an unclean spirit in the Synagogue. Vs. 23
  - B. The demon testified that Jesus is the “Holy One of God.” Vs. 24
  - C. Jesus rebuked the demon and cast him out of the man. Vs. 25
  - D. The demon came out of the man in a violent manner. Vs. 26
  - E. All the people were amazed. Vs. 27
  - F. The people questioned the authority of Jesus over the demons. Vs. 27
  - G. Immediately the fame of Jesus spread throughout Galilee. Vs. 28
- IX. Jesus heals Simon’s mother-in-law. Vs. 29-31
  - A. Jesus and the four fishermen went into Simon’s house. Vs. 29
  - B. Simon’s mother-in-law was sick with a fever. Vs. 30
  - C. Jesus took her by the hand, lifted her up and immediately the fever left her. Vs. 31

- X. Jesus heals the sick and those possessed with devils. Vs. 32-34
- A. The people brought the sick and possessed to Simon's house at sunset. Vs. 32-33
  - B. Jesus healed many that were sick of different diseases. Vs. 34
  - C. Jesus cast out many devils and would not let the devils speak, because they knew him. Vs. 34
- XI. Jesus on a preaching tour of Galilee. Vs. 35-39
- A. Jesus gets up early the next day before sunrise and goes to a solitary place to pray. Vs. 35
  - B. The four fishermen found him and told him that everyone is looking for him. Vs. 36-37
  - C. Jesus told them that his purpose was to go to the other towns and preach. Vs. 38
  - D. Jesus preached in their Synagogues throughout all Galilee. Vs. 39
  - E. Jesus cast out devils. Vs. 39
- XII. Jesus cleanses a man with leprosy. Vs. 40-45
- A. A man with leprosy came to Jesus. Vs. 40
    - 1. The leper knelt before Jesus. Vs. 40
    - 2. The leper pleaded with Jesus and said, "If thou wilt, thou canst make me clean." Vs. 40
  - B. Jesus was moved with compassion. Vs. 41
  - C. Jesus touched him. Vs. 41
  - D. Jesus said, "I will; be thou clean." Vs. 41
  - E. Immediately when Jesus spoke the leprosy departed and he was cleansed. Vs. 42
  - F. Jesus told the man to go to the priest. Vs. 44
    - 1. Follow the instructions of Moses to prove that he was cleansed. Vs. 44
  - G. Instead the man went out and told everyone what had happen. Vs. 45
    - 1. He published it much. Vs. 45
    - 2. He blazed it abroad. Vs. 45

H. Jesus had to go to the desert places. Vs. 45

1. The crowd was too large for the cities. Vs. 45
