Encyclopedia of The Bible – Nicolaitans

"They were a people who used Christian liberty as an occasion for the flesh, against such Paul warned (<u>Gal 5:13</u>). The enticement to such a course of action was the pagan society in which Christians lived where eating meat offered to idols was common. Sex relations outside marriage were completely acceptable in such a society. The Nicolaitans attempted to establish a compromise with the pagan society of the Graeco-Roman world that surrounded them. The people most susceptible to such teaching were, no doubt, the upper classes who stood to lose the most by a separation from the culture to which they had belonged before conversion."
