A. Do not be a moral hindrance to anyone.

1 Corinthians 8:9

B. Do not offend, but encourage others.

a) The vision of Cornelius.

Acts 10:1-8

1) Why didn't the Angel or Holy Spirit tell how to be saved?

Romans 10:14-15

b) The vision of Peter.

Acts 10:9-23

1) Peter went upon the housetop to pray.

Acts 10:9

2) Peter was hungry and fell into a trance.

Acts 10:10

3) A great sheet tied at the four corners was let down from heaven.

Acts 10:11

4) In the sheet were all manner of four-footed beasts, creeping things and fowls of the air.

Acts 10:12

5) Peter was told to kill and eat the animals in the sheet.

Acts 10:13

- 6) Peter refused because it was unlawful as a Jew to eat any thing that was common or unclean. Acts 10:14
- 7) Peter was told what God has cleansed was not to be called common. Acts 10:15
- 8) The sheet and animals were taken back to heaven and this process was repeated three times. Acts 10:16
- 9) While Peter was considering what all this meant, the men from Cornelius were at the gate of Simon's house. Acts 10:17
- 10) The Holy Spirit told Peter to go with the men to Cornelius. Acts 10:18-20
- 11) The next day Peter and certain brethren went to Cornelius with the men. Acts 10: 21-23
- c) Peter met Cornelius in Caesarea. Acts 10:24-33
- d) Peter preaches to the Gentiles. Acts 10:34-43
- e) The Gentiles receive the Holy Spirit. Acts 10:44-48
 - 1) While Peter spoke, the Holy Spirit fell on Cornelius and his group. Acts 10:44
 - 2) Peter asked, "Can any man forbid water, that these should not be baptized, which have received the Holy Ghost as well as we?" Acts 10:47
 - 3) They all were baptized in the name of the Lord. Acts 10:48
