The word "righteousness" (Strong's Greek Lexicon-1343 δικαιοσυνη dikaiosune *dik-ah-yos-oo'-nay* from 1342; TDNT-2:192,168; n f AV-righteousness 92; 92

1) in a broad sense: state of him who is as he ought to be, righteousness, the condition acceptable to God

1a) the doctrine concerning the way in which man may attain a state approved of God) means Salvation by grace. Ephesians 2:8-9

without the law

is manifested,

being witnessed

by the law and the prophets;

The Bible stands as a witness to the need of salvation by grace.

Even the righteousness of God vs. 22

unto all and upon all them

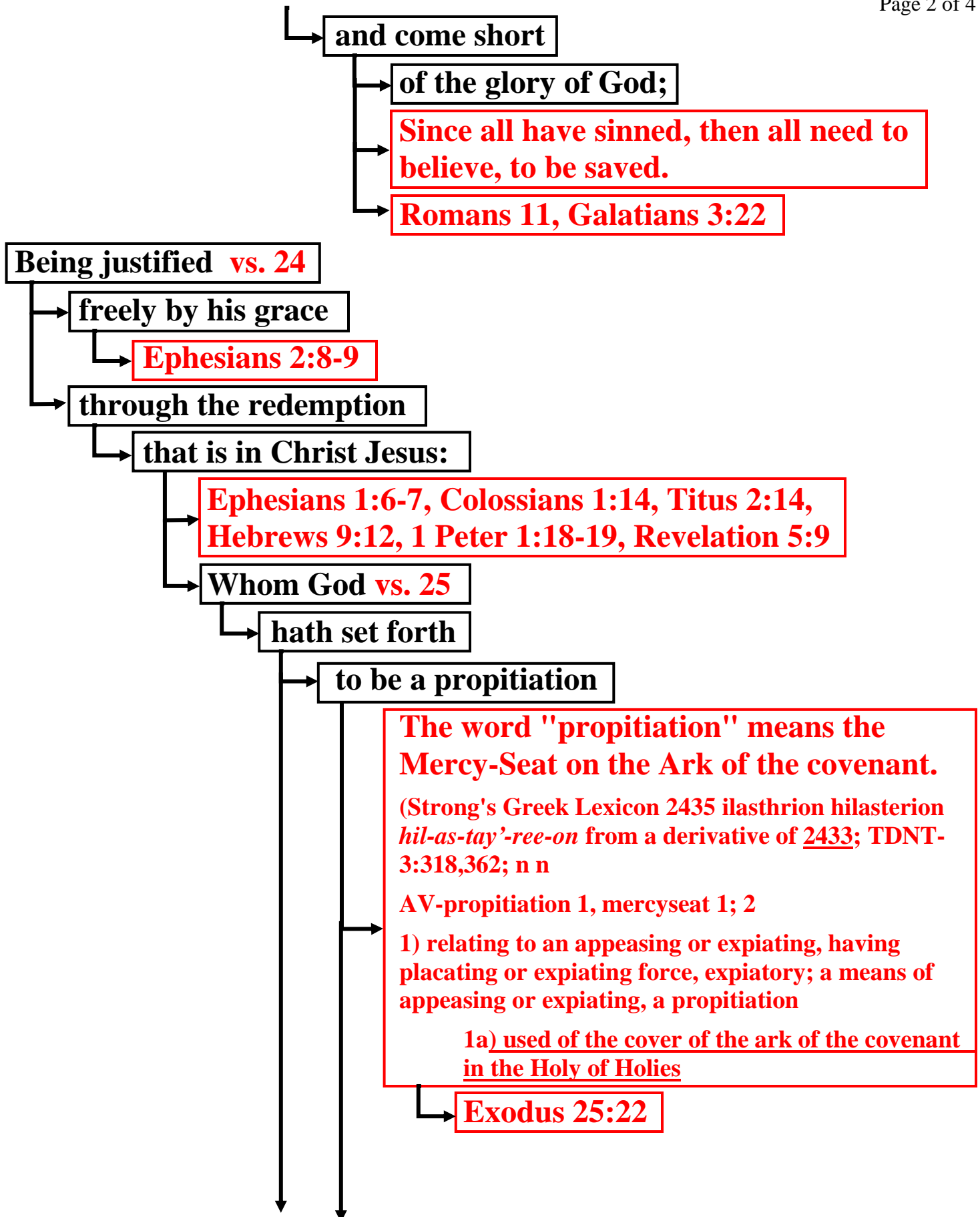
that believe:

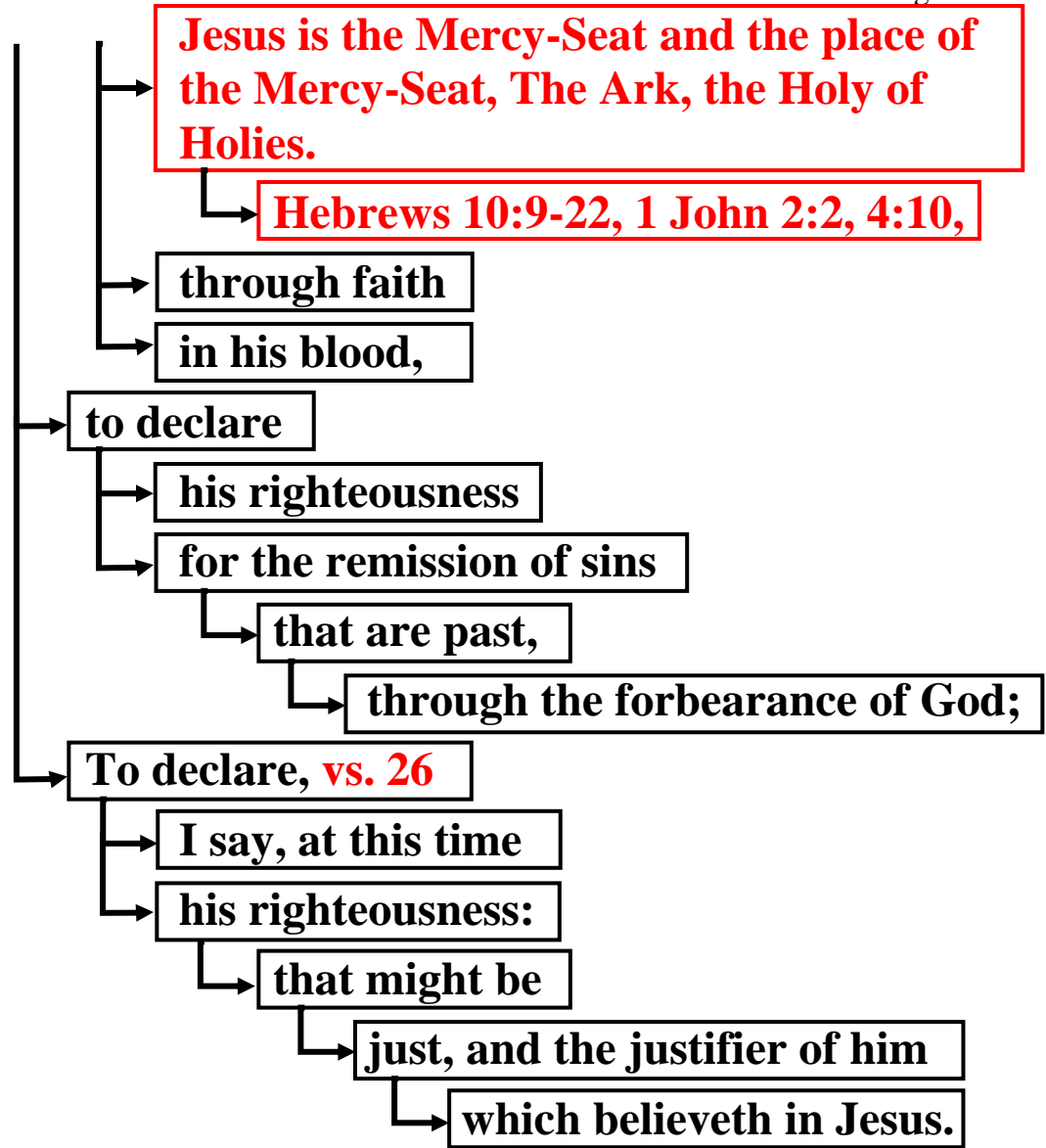
for there is no difference:

For all vs. 23

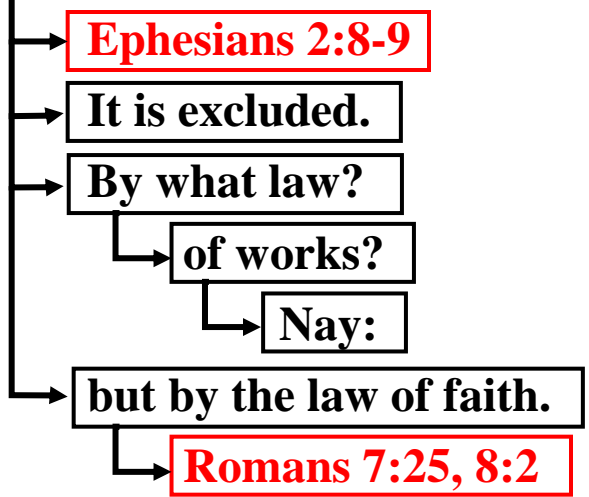
have sinned,

Is he the God of the Jews only? **vs. 29**

is he not also of the Gentiles?

Yes, of the Gentiles also:

Luke 24:47, Romans 10:12-13

Seeing it is one God, **vs. 30**

which shall justify

the circumcision by faith,

The Jews were raised in faith.

You have lost people raised in faith.

and uncircumcision through faith.

The Gentiles were raised out of faith.

You have lost people raised out of faith.

Do we then make void the law **vs. 31**
