2 Corinthians 11:2 "For I am jealous over you with godly jealousy: for I have espoused you to one husband, that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ."

John 3:29 "He that hath the bride is the bridegroom: but the friend of the bridegroom, which standeth and heareth him, rejoiceth greatly because of the bridegroom's voice: this my joy therefore is fulfilled."
Q3. He that the bride is the bridegroom, John the Baptist is the of the bridegroom.
Q4. John the Baptist rejoiced greatly because he the voice of the bridegroom.
Ephesians 5:24 "Therefore as the church is subject unto Christ, so <i>let</i> the wives <i>be</i> to their own husbands in every thing.  25 Husbands, love your wives, even as Christ also loved the church, and gave himself for it;"
Q5. Christ loved the and himself for it.
Ephesians 5:26 "That he might sanctify and cleanse it with the washing of water by the word, 27 That he might present it to himself a glorious church, not having spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing; but that it should be holy and without blemish. 28 So ought men to love their wives as their own bodies. He that loveth his wife loveth himself.
29 For no man ever yet hated his own flesh; but nourisheth and cherisheth it, even as the Lord the church:
30 For we are members of his body, of his flesh, and of his bones.

Matthew 24:32 "Now learn a parable of the fig tree; When his branch is yet tender, and putteth forth leaves, ye know that summer <i>is</i> nigh: 33 So likewise ye, when ye shall see all these things, know that it is near, <i>even</i> at the doors. 34 Verily I say unto you, This generation shall not pass, till all these things be fulfilled."
