## The Power of His Resurrection Philippians 3:10

April 17, '22

Philippians 3:10 "That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death;"

Q1. We are to know the \_\_\_\_\_ of the resurrection of Christ.

Matthew 27:57 "When the even was come, there came a rich man of Arimathaea, named Joseph, who also himself was Jesus' disciple: 58 He went to Pilate, and begged the body of Jesus. Then Pilate commanded the body to be delivered.

- 59 And when Joseph had taken the body, he wrapped it in a clean linen cloth,
- 60 And laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn out in the rock: and he rolled a great stone to the door of the sepulchre, and departed.

John 19:39 "And there came also Nicodemus, which at the first came to Jesus by night, and brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about an hundred pound *weight*.

- 40 Then took they the body of Jesus, and wound it in linen clothes with the spices, as the manner of the Jews is to bury.
- 41 Now in the place where he was crucified there was a garden; and in the garden a new sepulchre, wherein was never man yet laid.
- 42 There laid they Jesus therefore because of the Jews' preparation day; for the sepulchre was nigh at hand."

Joseph of Arimathaea and Nicodemus buried the body of Jesus in Joseph's new tomb.

After three days and three nights, Jesus changed the natural, earthly body to a spiritual, heavenly body as he raised it from death.

	42 And they gave him a piece of a broiled fish, and of an honeycomb. 43 And he took <i>it</i> , and did eat before them."
On	average middle age is from 30 to 50. Jesus was about 32, middle age when

he was raised. Therefore it is believed that the resurrected bodies of the saved

will not be older than middle age.
