Matthew 21:22 “And all things, whatsoever ye shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive.”

There are three Greek words for love.

1. <25>ἀγαπάω agapao *ag-ap-ah’-o*, translated as love 135 times and beloved 7 times. Never as charity.
2. <5368>φιλέω phileo *fil-eh’-o*, translated as love 22 times and kiss 3 times. Never as charity.
3. <26>ἀγάπη agape *ag-ah’-pay*, translated as love 86 times, charity 27 times, dear 1 time, charitably 1 time and feast of charity 1 time.

1 John 2:15 “Love not the world, neither the things *that are* in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him.

16 For all that *is* in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world.”

1 John 2:15 “Love [*ag-ap-ah’-o* (the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life)] not the world, neither the things *that are* in the world If any man love [*ag-ap-ah’-o* (the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life)] the world, the love [*ag-ah’-pay*] of the Father is not in him.”

Q10. The love of the _____ is *ag-ah’-pay*.

When love, *ag-ah’-pay*, is translated as charity, then it is the miracle of God’s love.

When you use the miracle of God’s love, then you are loving as charity.
