## Genesis 40 Romans 8:28

- I. Joseph interprets dreams. Vs. 1-19
  - A. The king's butler and baker were put in prison with Joseph. Vs. 1-4
  - B. The butler and baker each had a dream that they could not understand. Vs. 5-8
    - 1. Joseph told them that only God could interpret dreams. Vs. 8
    - 2. God would interpret the dreams to Joseph. Vs. 8
  - C. The dream of the butler. Vs. 9-11
    - 1. He dreamed of a vine with three branches. Vs. 9-10
    - 2. Each branch had clusters of ripe grapes. Vs. 10
    - 3. Pharaoh's cup was in the butler's hand. Vs. 11
    - 4. He pressed the grapes into Pharaoh's cup and gave it to Pharaoh. Vs. 11
  - D. Joseph interprets the dream. Vs. 12-13
    - 1. The three branches are three days. Vs. 12
    - 2. In three days the butler will be back at his position with the king. Vs. 13
  - E. Joseph asks the butler to remember him when he is back with Pharaoh. Vs. 14-15
  - F. The dream of the baker. Vs. 16-17
    - 1. He dreamed of three baskets on his head. Vs. 16
    - 2. The birds ate the food out of the top basket. Vs. 17
  - G. Joseph interprets the dream. Vs. 18-19
    - 1. The three baskets are three days. Vs. 18
    - 2. In three days Pharaoh will hang the butler, and the birds will eat his flesh. Vs. 19
  - H. Joseph's interpretation comes to pass. Vs. 20-23
    - 1. The butler is restored, and the baker is hanged. Vs. 20-22
    - 2. The butler forgets Joseph. Vs. 23
