III. There were 66 family members that went with Israel into Egypt, not counting Israel or Joseph and his two sons. Vs. 26

A. There are a total of 70 family members in Egypt, counting Israel, and Joseph with his two sons. Vs. 27

B. The difference between the count in Genesis 46:27 and Acts 7:14. In Acts 7:14 the five sons of Manasseh and Ephraim were probably added giving a total of 75. The *names* of the sons of Ephraim and Manasseh are recorded in 1 Chronicles 7:14-21.

Their names were Ashriel, Machir, Zelophehad, Peresh, sons of Manasseh; and Shuthelah, son of Ephraim.
