Exodus 26:5 “Fifty loops shalt thou make in the one curtain, and fifty loops shalt thou make in the edge of the curtain that is in the coupling of the second; that the loops may take hold one of another.”

Jesus wore three different robes during his trials and crucifixion.

Purple-Kingship of Jesus

The four colors are symbolic of Jesus, who is the only Potentate, King of kings and Lord of lords (purple) who came from heaven (blue) to shed his blood (scarlet) for our sins that we might be righteous (white) before God.
