## **Typology Lesson 6**

## Abraham & Isaac

Abraham is a type of God, the Father, and Isaac is a type of Jesus, The Son of God. The offering of Isaac by Abraham is a type of God offering Jesus for the world. The place that Abraham was to offer Isaac would be the same place that God would offer Jesus on the Cross. God did not let Abraham kill Isaac for the sacrifice, but provided a Ram instead. Now if God would have provided a Lamb instead of Isaac, then the sacrifice would have been completed. Since a Ram was provided instead of a Lamb, the sacrifice was postponed until the Lamb of God would be offered at the same place. This is why John the Baptist when he saw Jesus said, "Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world." John 1:29
